We had a major problem with pigeons, sparrows, starlings and sea gulls. I installed a product manufactured by Bird-X, Inc. and this pretty much eliminated our problems. We have a rather large area with overhangs and daily we would get large gatherings of birds. Almost immediately, we noticed the birds leaving the area.
